#### REMARKS:

According to Article 26A, Section 401.2. Sanitation: Housing facilities, including primary enclosures and cages, shall be kept in a clean condition in order to maintain a healthy environment for the animal. This shall include removing and destroying any agents injurious to the health of the animal and periodic cleanings. The primary enclosure or cage shall be constructed so as to eliminate excess water, excretions, and waste material.

Wastes must be removed on a daily basis and disinfection must occur no less than every two weeks.

According to Article 26A, 401.5 (a) the veterinary plan must dictate how the pet dealer is to medically treat dogs/cats. Any prescription medications on site (used preventatively) must be accounted for in the veterinary plan. Preventative medications include, but are not limited to: vaccines, deworming medication, and medications used for nebulizing. Any non-routine veterinary care requires written proof from attending veterinarian, including the use of over the counter medications not labeled for dogs or cats. Medications used to treat specific illnesses must be clearly identified with a label from the attending veterinarian and individual animal information. Any deviation from the veterinary plan must be documented in written form by the attending veterinarian. There must be a written signature log with dates showing a veterinarian has been to the facility at least once every 12 months.

The veterinary plan must be able to confirm veterinary services including emergency care, describe technique for daily observation, detail frequency of veterinary visits (animal to veterinarian or veterinarian to premises), and explain type of training staff is given on animal handling instruction.

According to Article 7, Section 109.1(a): The owner of any dog reaching the age of four months shall immediately make application for a dog license.
