According to Article 26A, Section 401.5 (a):

The veterinary plan must dictate how the pet dealer is to medically treat dogs/cats. Any prescription medications on site (used preventatively) must be accounted for in the veterinary plan. Preventative medications include, but are not limited to: vaccines, deworming medication, and medications used for nebulizing. Any non-routine veterinary care requires written proof from attending veterinarian, including the use of over the counter medications not labeled for dogs or cats. Medications used to treat specific illnesses must be clearly identified with a label from the attending veterinarian and individual animal information. Any deviation from the veterinary plan must be documented in written form by the attending veterinarian.

According to Article 26A, Section 402. Records of purchase and sale:

Each pet dealer shall keep and maintain records for each animal purchased, acquired, held, sold, or otherwise disposed of. Records for each animal shall be maintained for a period of two years from the date of sale or transfer, whichever occurs later. During normal business hours, the records shall be made available to persons authorized by law to enforce the provisions of this article.

According to Article 35D, Section 753-b. Information statement for purchaser:

Every pet dealer shall deliver to the purchaser of an animal, at the time of sale, a written statement in a standardized form prescribed by the commissioner of Agriculture and Markets.
