Upper walls in multiple runs have been chewed/scratched by dogs, exposing unsealed wood which can not be cleaned/sanitized properly. Rusted wire kennel panels can not be cleaned/sanitized properly. Spilled kibble on floor of main shelter entrance room.

REMARKS:

All enclosures housing seized dogs must be structurally sound and kept in good repair to keep the dog contained and to protect it from injury. There must be no rust, jagged edges or sharp points. All surfaces within the primary enclosure must be replaced or repaired when worn or damaged. Dirty, rough and absorbent materials protect microorganisms and are difficult to clean, disinfect and deodorize. Repair or replace damaged sections to prevent dogs from ingesting any materials that may come loose from chewing and clawing the enclosure.

Trash and waste products on the premises must be stored properly in leak proof, covered containers away from housing and food storage areas. This is necessary to minimize the risks of disease transmission, food contamination and vermin. At regular intervals, all stored trash and wastes must be removed from the premises. Good housekeeping and sanitary practices are essential for rodent and pest control. Empty feed bags, cans and any other garbage must not accumulate on the premises.

Records for all dogs seized and held at the shelter for Article 7 reasons must be complete at the time of inspection. This often is accomplished by communication between the municipal offices, the contracted shelter and the DCO. According to Article 7, Section 113.4, every dog control officer, peace officer, when acting pursuant to his special duties or police officer shall promptly make and maintain a complete record of any seizure AND subsequent disposition of any dog.

Since shelter inspections are unannounced, copies of seizure and disposition reports and written contracts for all contracted municipalities must be left at the shelter and available for inspection.

According to Article 7, Sections 117.4 and 117.6, the DCO or shelter cannot release an "Article 7" dog unless the owner shows proof of a current license and proof that the correct impoundment fee has been paid; the new license number issued must also be recorded in order to determine compliance at the time of inspection. As discussed at the inspection, even if the dog is harbored in a different municipality or state, the owner must provide proof of licensing before release. A current license from another municipality/state is acceptable. If there is no licensing entity in the municipality where the dog is harbored, then the dog can always be licensed to wherever it is currently staying (e.g. a family member, campground/seasonal or friend's address) or even the town/city hall's address, but it MUST have a current license in order to be released.

A secondary shelter building has been added to use for additional holding space/ isolation if needed. Presently, it is only being used for storage, but it does have extra wire/metal kennels available for use. There was no heat source/insulation available in this building, so it is not approved for holding dogs during cold/inclement weather.
