These are the findings of an inspection of your facility on the date(s) indicated above:

1. Shelter is structurally sound

In outdoor kennels, repairs needed on crumbling/missing concrete blocks. Dividing walls of several interior kennels not structurally sound and move when pushed on by dogs. No

2. Housing area and equipment is sanitized regularly

Rusted/corroded pipes/chain link, unsealed concrete block walls, and exposed insulation and drywall are unable to be cleaned/sanitized properly.

3. Repairs are done when necessary

4. Dogs are handled safely

In both interior and outdoor kennels, dividing walls and doors have rusted/corroded pipes with sharp edges exposed walls/doors the dogs. Chain link of several kennels are excessively rusted/corroded. to Crumbling/cracked/missing concrete block in exterior runs. Missing/damaged tiles on walls of interior runs. Several PVC wall panels chewed/damaged. Several chain link panels on dividing walls and doors in need of repair. Gaps in chainlink doors could allow for potential escape and/or injury.

REMARKS:

All enclosures housing seized dogs must be structurally sound and kept in good repair to keep the dog contained and to protect it from injury. There must be no rust, jagged edges or sharp points. All surfaces within the primary enclosure must be replaced or repaired when worn or damaged. Dirty, rough and absorbent materials protect microorganisms and are difficult to clean, disinfect and deodorize. There must be no openings where an animal can become entrapped. Housing must be constructed and arranged to allow easy removal of the dog without injury. Repair or replace damaged sections to prevent dogs from ingesting any materials that may come loose from chewing and clawing the enclosure. Any openings where dogs can escape must be closed. Rust needs to be removed and surfaces repaired to allow proper sanitation.

According to Article 7, Section 113.4, Copies of completed seizure and disposition reports and written contracts must be left at the shelter and available for inspection for all contracted municipalities.

Written contracts or lease agreements for primary shelter services for the City of Olean and Towns of Conewango, Franklinville, Ischua, Little Valley, Napoli, Randolph, South Valley, and Yorkshire have all expired.

According to Article 7 Section 114. Pounds and shelters,

1. Each town and city, and each village in which licenses are issued shall, and any other village and any county may, establish and maintain a pound or shelter for dogs.

2. In lieu of or in addition to establishing and maintaining such pound or shelter, any town or city, or any village in which licenses are issued shall, and any other village and any county may, contract for pound or shelter services with any other municipality or with any incorporated humane society or similar incorporated dog protective association, or shall establish and maintain, jointly or with one or more other municipalities, a pound or shelter.
