## **REMARKS:**

There have been no structural repairs made to the shelter since the last inspection which was done six months ago. There were two dogs housed in the kennel since the last inspection. The kennel was clean (due to Mr. Henry's diligence), but the drainage problems persist. There has been no effort made to contract with another municipality at this time and no work was done to correct the deficiencies noted in the last inspection.

The town supervisor, after speaking with Gary Hadsell (DCO/shelter manager for the towns of Canisteo and Greenwood), Mike Henry (DCO for the town of Hartsville) and me has given his assurance that the town will contract with Canisteo for shelter services. This may be an interim agreement if the town of Hartsville decides that they wish to construct a new shelter or repair the current shelter to meet our minimum requirements.

I have marked this inspection satisfactory for 60 days to give the town the opportunity to work out a contract for shelter services with the town of Canisteo. If the issue at hand is not resolved within that time period, then the current shelter will be deemed unsatisfactory at that time.
