The correct impoundment fees were not appropriately charged to an owner of dogs seized the same day and one dog seized again a few months later.

## **REMARKS:**

City of Lackawanna Code 66-10 states "the impoundment fee shall be \$25 for the seizure and \$16 per each day or portion thereof after the seizure."

The following fees recorded as being paid are not in the amount stipulated in the city code:

Dog Control # 1/12 - seized 2/9/12, redeemed 2/10/12, recorded a \$25 impoundment fee payment

Dog Control # 6/12 - seized 4/4/12, redeemed 4/5/12, recorded a \$25 impoundment fee payment

Dog Control # 13/12 - seized 6/19/12, no redemption date recorded, recorded a \$25 impoundment fee payment

Dog Control # 21/12 - seized 8/22/12, redeemed 8/23/12, recorded a \$25 impoundment fee payment

Dog Control #25/12 - seized 11/26/12, redeemed 11/28/12, recorded a \$41 impoundment fee payment

Two dogs owned by the same person were seized 2/12/12. The impoundment fee collected was calculated as the first impoundment for each dog. A dog belonging to the same person was seized on 5/12/12 and the impoundment fee calculated as the second impoundment. City of Lackawanna Code 66-10 states that a "person" who had a dog seized in the five years prior will pay higher fees upon subsequent seizures. In this case, the impoundment fees should have been calculated for a first and second seizure on 2/12 and a third seizure on 5/12.
