| <i>There are still cages that are unusable. The individual kennels are very difficult to clean properly. The drain was filled with concrete so there is no inside drainage. A holding tank for the dog waste was installed at great cost. This is OK, but drainage into the tank will be difficult in the winter since the water is likely to freeze without an indoor drain.</i> | |

Although the holding tank for the animal waste was installed, there still remain some deficiencies with respect to ease of cleaning the kennel and ventilation. These are serious enough to justify a reinspection in three months to ensure that the deficiencies are adequately addressed. The shelter will receive a satisfactory rating today since the major deficiencies detailed in the last inspection report were addressed. More work needs to be done to ensure the physical integrity of the shelter and will be rated as unsatisfactory at the next inspection if the mentioned deficiencies are not resolved.
