There are still cages that are unusable. The individual kennels are very difficult to clean properly. The drain was filled with concrete so there is no inside drainage. A holding tank for the dog waste was installed at great cost. This is OK, but drainage into the tank will be difficult in the winter since the water is likely to freeze without an indoor drain.

Ventilation is poor. There is only one tiny box fan and the kennel has a "doggy smell". An exhaust fan would be beneficial to help move air through the kennel.
