There were six outdoor runs that had sharp metal pieces protruding from the walls. This could present a source of serious injury to the dogs.

REMARKS:

Six of the outdoor dog runs have sharp pieces of metal sticking out of the walls that could result in serious injury to the dogs. This was also observed and noted at the last inspection.

One dog was adopted out before the redemption period had elapsed. All redeemed dogs were licensed and the redeemed dogs noted not to be licensed at the last inspection have since been licensed in their respective municipalities.

The shelter looks much better in general since many of the rooms have been painted and repairs have been done on the walls. The surgery suite is clean and well organized. The food storage area is clean and the food stored properly.

The contract with the city of Hornell has been updated and is now current.

When a municipal dog is "transferred" to the Hornell Humane Society for adoption after the redemption period has elapsed, it should be written as such on the seizure/disposition report. This was explained to the representative(s) present for the inspection.

The new shelter manager, Josh Farnahm, was not present at the time of this inspection.
