The Town of Tonawanda has set in local law 71-7.a that impoundment fees increase upon subsequent seizure of any dog owned by a person. Three dogs owned by one individual were not charged the proper fees as is written in the law. In a phone call with the Town of Tonawanda DCO, it was learned that this procedure is too complicated for the financial officers involved.

Section 117.4 of Article 7 of NY State Agriculture and Markets Laws provides for the amount of the impoundment fee to be collected and also allows for a municipality to set their own fees through local law or ordinance. The fees that are set by law must be collected. If changes are needed, Section 71-7.d of the Town of Tonawanda law provides that their fee can be changed by resolution of the Town Board.

It is expected that the proper fees will be collected or changes made to the law. If not, a deficiency will be noted at the next inspection of the Town of Tonawanda DCO and/or Town of West Seneca Animal Shelter.
