These are the findings of an inspection of your facility on the date(s) indicated above:

1. Shelter is structurally sound

2. Housing area and equipment is sanitized regularly

Porous containers and bedding materials that are stored in a dog run may absorb moisture or infectious airborne debris when the housing area is cleaned and sanitized. Non-porous storage containers should be utilized or the porous items removed from animal housing areas.

3. Repairs are done when necessary

Yes

A work order has been submitted for needed repairs. Guillotine doors on some dog runs are rusted out or jagged. The runs are marked that no dog is to be housed in them until the doors are replaced. Wallboard that has pulled away from the walls in a few dog runs will be repaired or replaced with tile.

The outer kennel area plywood walls have lost some of their sealant properties and may absorb liquids. Although not in direct contact with any animals, applying new sealant would make the wood surfaces impervious which would allow for thorough sanitation and faster drying times.

In the case of multiple dogs that are owned by a person and are seized, the law requires the fee be increased. In three such situations, the municipalities did not increase the fee. Municipal clerks should review Section 117.4 of Article 7 of NYS Agriculture and Markets Law and their own ordinances regarding the amount of the fee to be collected upon the subsequent seizure of any dog owned by that person. Impoundments are counted against the owner, not the dog. For example, if two dogs owned by a person are seized the same day a fee must be collected for a first and second impoundment.
