REMARKS:

**Part 77.2 of NYS Codes, Rules and Regulations requires that all dogs seized under Article 7 "... shall be properly cared for, sheltered, fed and watered for the redemption period..." "Properly cared for" includes veterinary care when necessary. A common sense evaluation of the seized dog by the DCO is necessary to determine when that care is necessary. If a dog has obvious injuries, such as porcupine quills, the animal needs to be seen by a veterinarian to assure the animal is maintained in a state a comfort throughout the redemption period.**
