The public doesn't realize there was is doggy door flaps for the dogs to move in and out as they please and water and food were kept in side. My concerns are with the public being able to get close enough to touch the municipal dogs and feed the dogs. I would recommend putting up some type of fencing where the dogs cannot see the public and the public cannot get close enough to touch or feed the dogs. If something were to happen like a dog bite or a dog getting sick from food or scraps the town may be liable.
