The redemption period by local law is no less than 3 days for unidentified dogs. It was discussed that a day is defined as a 24 hour period from midnight to midnight.

It was discussed that a contract with another municipality or SPCA for sheltering services must be in place in order for a dog to be held for the remainder of the redemption period at that municipal shelter or SPCA.

It was discussed that dogs seized under Article 7 are the responsibility of the municipality until redeemed, adopted or euthanized. Foster homes are not an allowed disposition under Section 177 of Article 7.

17. Redeemed dogs are licensed before release

All dogs redeemed or adopted from the shelter that will be harbored in the City of Buffalo are issued license applications. The shelter is authorized by local law to provide the applications and collect the required fee. The collected fees are than remitted to the City Clerk.

It was discussed that for dogs redeemed by residents of other municipalities, the owner may need to return to the municipality where they reside in order to obtain a license before the dog is redeemed.

18. Proper impoundment fees paid before dogs are released

Impoundment fees are collected by the shelter as provided in Chapter 175 of the city code and set in Section 78-12 of local law.

REMARKS:

The accumulation of shelter supplies overflows into animal housing areas which may hamper sanitation and ventilation. Porous materials such as cloth, cardboard and paper materials will absorb and retain moisture. Only supplies needed for that animal housing area should be stored there. The use of storage containers is encouraged. A cabinet constructed over cat cages would allow for storage, reduced exposure of supplies to moisture, a reduction of clutter and an improved aesthetic quality of the area.
