The drain has been plugged and water is likely to freeze once the cold weather sets in. Ventilation issues will also be addressed in the future. A plan for repairs has been prepared by Thomas N. Fraser, who provides engineering and design services.

The town board is very engaged with respect to rectifying problems with the current shelter. The shelter is at least 30 years old and work will continue to be done to address any problems. The Board is currently considering re-designing/updating the existing facility.
