## **REMARKS**:

Shelter must be structurally sound at all times. repairs to shelter cages must be completed in order to properly house Article 7 dogs when necessary. All food must be contained properly to prevent vermin or moisture contaminants.

Records must be complete at the time of inspection this often is accomplished by communication between the municipal offices, the contracted shelter and the DCO.

According to Article 7 section 117.4 Dog Control, municipal shelters and municipalities may not waive Impoundment fees or charge less than the statutory rates for impoundment fees unless a local ordinance has been written. All dogs which are seized/ picked up for Article 7 reasons a disposition report must be filled out and an impoundment fee collected even if returning the dog to the owner. All impound fees collected must be recorded somewhere with the disposition reports in order to determine this at the time of inspection. The shelter cannot release an "Article 7" dog unless the owner shows proof of current license and identification and proof that the impoundment fee has been paid. According to Article 7 Section 113.4 and 113.5All records must reflect this information has been verified and be included in the disposition report.

Statutory rates for Impoundment fees are as follows and may not be less than \$10 for the first impoundment, \$20 for the 2nd and first 24 hours, then +\$3 per day or \$30 for 3rd and first 24 hours, then +\$3 per day, unless there is a written local ordinance stating a specific circumstance.

These fees/ count against the owner not the dog. Therefore, if an owner redeems his 2 dogs that would be considered a first and a second offense.
