These are the findings of an inspection of your facility on the date(s) indicated above:

A. Standards of Care

1. Shelter is structurally sound

2. Housing area and equipment is sanitized regularly

I was at the shelter at 1 pm. There were three dogs housed in the shelter. There were five piles of feces in the first cage, three piles of vomitus and two piles of feces in the second cage and four piles of feces in the third cage. The third cage had no outdoor accessibility. The food/water bowls were dirty and the shelter had a foul odor. Although there were dog doors with access to outside kennels, the doors were closed and it looked as if the dogs were not let outside recently. There were no feces in any of the outdoor runs.

3. Repairs are done when necessary

Repairs to the kennel have been done in the past. A new building is to be constructed within the next year to house municipal dogs.

4. Dogs are handled safely

The shelter had a foul odor as soon as I entered. This was due to the build-up of feces and vomitus from the dogs housed in the kennel.

8. Drainage is adequate

There was a heater in the kennel. However, it really wasn't powerful enough for the amount of space in the kennel. It was only 25 degrees F outside and it was still fairly cold in the kennel. All the dogs were acclimated though, so it probably wasn't a real problem.

10. Clean food and water is available and in ample amount

The food and water bowls were very dirty. Although water was provided, all of the water bowls were empty.

11. Veterinary care is provided when necessary

Dogs are euthanized at the Canisteo Veterinary Hospital. I was alerted to the fact that an appointment was made by the DCO to euthanize at least two dogs on the Friday before my scheduled appointment to inspect the shelter.

REMARKS:

This was an unannounced inspection of the Canisteo town dog shelter. I had an appointment scheduled with the town DCO to do the yearly inspection on Saturday, January 15th. I went to the shelter ahead of our scheduled meeting to inspect it without advance warning. The highway superintendent was present; he gave me the key to enter the shelter. What I found was horrific! Please see my comments on the list of "deficiencies'.

The kennel and cages housing the dogs were filthy. Multiple piles of dog feces were in every occupied cage and one of the dogs was obviously ill as evidenced by the vomit present in the cage. The dogs did not seem to have access to the outdoor runs recently as evidenced by the lack of any fecal/urinary debris in them. The dog dishes were dirty. The rubber mats on which the dogs could lay on were also dirty. The ventilation was inadequate because the odor from the feces/urine in the cages was overwhelming. Although the shelter is old and isn't the most conducive to great comfort, there is no excuse for the condition of the environment in which the dogs are kept.
