Regarding sanitizing: No dogs were in the shelter but floor surfaces needed sweeping. Continued cold winter weather makes cleaning and disinfecting difficult. It is recommended that thorough cleaning be done during warm breaks in the weather.

Regarding licensing and payment of a redemption fee: The DCO of the Towns of Lewiston and Porter handle their own redemptions. Copies of their Seizure and Disposition reports were on file, as is required, but DCO Culverwell had recently asked the Lewiston Town Clerk for the copies. The Lewiston DCO documents seizure information at the time of impoundment but dogs are physically redeemed at the Lewiston Town Clerk's office. Since disposition information is not known at the time the DCO picks up the dog at the shelter, it is expected that he sends this information to DCO Culverwell as soon as possible as complete records must be kept on file at the shelter at all times.
