Upon calling the previously known DCO about the situation, Keith and the inspector were informed that the Town of Allen has a new DCO. The new DCO informed Keith and the inspector that he had two dogs in the kennel and one was currently at the veterinary office in Wellsville. He was informed by the inspector that the level of care was insufficient and it had to be rectified ASAP.
