REMARKS:

Housing area that is designated for after hours drop off for DCOs has accumulated some clutter that MUST be removed. Clutter that was observed upon inspection included cat trees, empty mop buckets, glass aquariums, exotic/small animal cages, and garbage transport carts.

After hours housing area MUST remain free of any materials that could obstruct the ease of handling animals in a confined space and restrict vehicle access into the drop off area.

An adequate number of small and medium kennels are available in the after hours housing area. However, there are only 2 large dog kennels. It is recommended that at least two more extra large kennels be made available to accommodate the number of municipalities that the shelter is servicing.

Food bags MUST be stored off of the floor and any unopened bags MUST be sealed or transferred to a waterproof container to avoid any spoilage.

It is recommended that animal handling equipment such as catch poles, nets etc. stored in the after hours drop off area be easily accessible for DCOs.
