These are the findings of an inspection of your facility on the date(s) indicated above:

The wire crate panel put over the window within the center kennel as a temporary repair measure has been left in place and is now rusted and the wires are bent and/or broken off in the bottom sections within reach of dogs. The wooden window frame has also been damaged and has bare wood exposed along the bottom edge and lower sides.

4. Dogs are handled safely

The one dog being housed at the time of inspection was found running loose within the facility upon the inspector's arrival. There was splintered wood strewn about inside the building from the dog chewing/clawing on wooden trim & shelving. The dog had also gotten into and chewed up some trash.

The shelter manager stated that the dog had been climbing/jumping out of the 8' kennel on a daily basis since its impoundment 6 days before. He stated that he had notified the town of the problem and risk of injury to the dog, but that no steps had been taken by the town to enclose the top of the kennel as he had requested and that he had been denied permission to transfer the dog to another shelter facility for the remainder of the redemption period.

As the redemption period had expired as of the day of the inspection, ownership was transferred and the dog was removed from the shelter to be transported to a local incorporated rescue immediately following the inspection.

The latch and fencing on the gate of the outdoor exercise pen have been damaged so that dogs may escape or become injured-the inspector advised that it cannot be used until the gate is repaired or replaced.
