REMARKS:

According to Article 7 section 117.4 Dog Control, municipal shelters and municipalities may not waive impoundment fees or charge less than the statutory rates for impoundment fees. For all dogs which are seized/picked up for Article 7 reasons, a disposition report must be filled out and an impoundment fee collected even if returning the dog to the owner. All impoundment fees collected must be recorded somewhere within the disposition reports in order to determine this at the time of inspection. The shelter cannot release an "Article 7" dog unless the owner shows proof of current license and proof that the impoundment fee has been paid. According to Article 7 Section 113.4 and 113.5, all records must reflect this information and be verified and included in the disposition report.

Statutory rates for impoundment fees are as follows and may not be less than \$10 for the first impoundment, \$20 for the second impoundment plus \$3 per day after the first 24 hours, and \$30 for third impoundment plus \$3 per day after the first 24 hours, unless there is a written local ordinance stating a specific circumstance. If your municipality chooses to make the fees higher, no local ordinance is necessary - just state it in the monthly board meeting minutes.

These impoundment fees count against the owner, not the dog. Therefore, if an owner redeems their two dogs, that would be considered a first and a second offense.
