REMARKS:

A written contract or lease agreement for shelter services must be established between DCO Pyc and the Town of Sardinia.

Article 7 Section § 114. Pounds and shelters.

1. Each town and city, and each village in which licenses are issued shall, and any other village and any county may, establish and maintain a pound or shelter for dogs.

2. In lieu of or in addition to establishing and maintaining such pound or shelter, any town or city, or any village in which licenses are issued shall, and any other village and any county may, contract for pound or shelter services with any other municipality or with any incorporated humane society or similar incorporated dog protective association, or shall establish and maintain, jointly or with one or more other municipalities, a pound or shelter.

For constructed primary enclosures, poured concrete is one of the best materials to use for flooring because of its ease of maintenance, durability, and seamless nature. Due to its porosity, concrete must be treated with a liquid sealer or hardener to make it waterproof. Waterproofing prevents water damage to concrete and allows thorough sanitization and disinfection. This same technique can be applied to the concrete block walls. Junctions with the floor and walls must be aligned and properly sealed. All surfaces within the primary enclosure must be replaced or repaired when worn or damaged. Dirty, rough and absorbent materials protect microorganisms and are difficult to clean, disinfect and deodorize.
