The surfaces of floors and walls of facility where animals come in contact with are not impervious and are in need of minor repair.

Article 26 C; Section 424.1 All indoor building surfaces in direct contact with animals must be constructed of materials that are impervious, non-porous, non-toxic, and able to withstand regular cleaning and disinfection.

Critical Deficiency

Primary enclosure does not allow normal postural adjustments. Primary enclosure does not allow movement without encountering bowl, or beds.

Primary enclosure shall provide sufficient space to allow normal postural adjustments, fully stretch body and have sufficient room to circle, lie down, and stand upright without head or tail touching sides of enclosure even in the presence of food or water bowls, beds, litter boxes, and other normal cage objects.

Daily exploration for dogs is not documented. Additional enrichment not documented for all animals.

Additional measures for enrichment and stress reduction shall be implemented and documented for any animal showing persistent hiding, hostile interactions, reduced activity, depression/social withdrawal, barrier frustration or aggression, self-injurious behavior, repetitive non goal-oriented movement or stereotypic behaviors.

General Deficiency

Behavioral evaluation history not disclosed. Behavioral evaluations not performed by trained staff; not documented for all animals.

At time of animal's transfer, shelters must disclose all available information regarding behavior of animal. This shall include (but not limited to) prior history, observed behavior in shelter, results of behavioral evaluations.
