- *All incoming animals shall be assessed within two hours after intake by a trained animal shelter staff member to determine if any physical abnormalities exist that require immediate veterinary attention.*
- *Ability to provide veterinary assessment in a timely fashion through in-house facilities or at an off-site location.*
 - *Each animal in custody or possession shall be provided with complete physical examination by trained staff within 24 hours of intake. Animals are to be specifically examined for bite wounds to determine potential rabies exposure (if applicable, shelters must comply with reporting requirements).*
 - *Any animal in custody or possession of shelter for more than 30 days shall be weighed and examined at least once a month (at least every 6 months for foster care animals) by trained staff.*
