To: Entities Interested in Farmland Protection Implementation Activities

Re: Request for Proposals for Hudson Valley Agricultural Enhancement Program

The New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets is pleased to announce the availability of funding for the Hudson Valley Agricultural Enhancement Program (HVAEP), which was announced in Governor Cuomo's 2015-16 Executive Budget and approved in the final 2015-16 Budget by the State Legislature. This regional program supporting farmland preservation efforts offers \$20 million in state assistance for farmland protection projects within the Hudson Valley region. For the purposes of this grant opportunity, the Hudson Valley region shall include:

Albany Putnam Sullivan
Columbia Rensselaer Ulster
Dutchess Rockland Washington
Greene Saratoga Westchester
Orange Schenectady

Eligible applicants include:

- counties with state-approved agricultural and farmland protection plans;
- municipalities that have adopted a local farmland protection plan;
- soil and water conservation districts; and
- not-for-profit conservation organizations (referred to as "land trusts").

For this grant opportunity, only implementation projects that result in perpetual conservation easements are eligible for funding, regardless of whether that transaction is for the Purchase of Development Rights (PDR), or the Transfer of Development Rights (TDR), or the donation of the full value of development rights.

All proposals must be submitted through the New York State Grants Gateway portal by 4:30 p.m., January 29, 2016.
